### **Chair's Report**

This year sees much of the committee in their third year of a possible three years, in accordance with the constitution they should stand down at the AGM having completed three years, however, there hasn't exactly been a stampede of volunteers offering their services, consequently the Committee agreed to seek approval of Third Age Trust (TAT) to a change to the constitution which would allow officer(s) / Committee member(s) to extend their term office if approved at the AGM. The TAT approved the change on 24<sup>th</sup> March 2025, providing approved by the AGM.
