Chair's Report

This is my last report as your chair, with a three-year gap where I led the YHAR it's been 7-years, which has been a real privilege, a pleasure and at times challenging. If agreed at the meeting, Linda Hoole will be taking up the reigns. I wish her well and will continue to support her and the committee.

During the year we have welcomed two new Trustees, Wendy Brown and Maggie McLellan. Maggie's remit is the Inclusion Officer, of which she says will be more after the official business.

The way that the AGM is held is changing: the committee agreed that this year we will only accept questions submitted in advance, and of 2027 the meeting will be live streamed with voting online as well as the option to attend in person. This will be a fresh challenge but with over 1000 members and only about 100 attending we will open the meeting to all via the internet.

40th Anniversary celebrations, (not 50 years) has included a Treasure Trail, Quiz Night, Film Night and lastly a music night with our very own Jacqui Eames as the musical director and lead singer. These events have been well supported. Thanks to everyone who organised and supported these events.

Monthly meetings, a massive thank you to all those involved in organising. As I hope you'll agree these have been very successful. Jacqui Eames, our speaker co-ordinator, steps down this autumn. Jacqui has provided a very eclectic mix, thanks.

Membership, the good news is our membership continues to increase, we are nearly back to pre-covid numbers at over a thousand. A reminder that membership can be renewed from 1st July, 2 months before the new membership year starts on 1st September.

Joining groups will not be open until 7th August the day after the Open event on 6th August. From feedback we tried to be as fair and transparent as possible, with only essential members, such as admin assistants, signed up before groups were opened to the membership. The exception was any new member joining at the Open Event was allowed to join one group. By and large this worked, with the only problem of Group Leaders filling up groups beforehand. The plan for this year is they should not add non-essential members until joining is opened to all.

We (the committee) acknowledge that some members require assistance renewing and joining groups and for these we will continue to provide assistance at help desk sessions from 1st July. These will include Monthly meetings, the Summer Programme Event, and after but NOT AT Open Event in August;

Website, it continues to evolve thanks in the main from members' feedback. It is our shop window, and Nick Jarvis regularly reviews it to ensure its relevant and up to date. Thanks, one and all, particularly to George Mackley and Mike Valliant.
